### Coronavirus (Covid 19): Easing Restrictions

#### Context

In late March we curtailed all club events, runs and meetings due to the government response to the coronavirus (see **MCMA Bulletin No. 2 Coronavirus**). There will be no MCMA meetings until further notice. Likewise, there will be no club runs or events until further notice. I have been approached by a number of members with questions related to the future of club runs for the rest of 2020. This bulletin addresses the means, and your responsibilities, by which you might use your HVS/CVS vehicle that is registered with MCMA as your primary club.

#### Historic and Classic Registrations

Members will still be required to comply with RMS and MCMA registration requirements or vehicles will become unregistered. Scrutineers are still available for vehicle inspection by appointment on a one vehicle (one person) at a time basis, with the monthly inspections suspended. Contact details for the scrutineers are in the newsletter

#### What do members need to do?

Members need to adhere to all government health authorities' widely-published COVID-19 rules/regulations/guidelines related to personal hygiene and behaviours in public.

#### Driving/Riding your HVS/CVS Vehicle

With the governments' slight easing of restrictions, MCMA members now have some latitude. As there are no official MCMA runs, you are able to drive or ride your HCS/CVS vehicle on public roads through your logbook entry. You can also invite friends or club members to share a drive, but please note that there needs to be responsibility taken by all to ensure that:

1. It is clearly understood by all participating in the drive that it is a private arrangement and not an official MCMA run.
2. Someone takes the responsibility to lead the drive and invite others to join in, if applicable.
3. Drives should not venture more than 50 kilometres from home.
4. Drives are limited to a maximum of 10 people.
5. It is absolutely inappropriate if a number of privately organised drives meet at a common place and the number of participants exceeds 10 people.
6. Logbook entries must be accurately made before leaving home.
7. Such drives will not contribute to our MCMA Milestone Awards.
